There are a lot of changes since our last invitational, but I think it will turn out to be a great event.

I want to call your attention to our Local Rules that are attached. Particularly to the "Out of Bounds" section and "Hole Number 10".

OUT OF BOUNDS - Our Ladies Club, and the Men's Club as well, did not adopt the new "Out of Bounds" rule that would allow you to drop where the ball went out of bounds. So, our rule remains that if you hit out of bounds or think your ball is out of bounds you should hit a provisional ball, or else you will have to go back and hit another ball where originally hit from. BUT ---- for the INVITATIONAL, we were advised by Brandon that we needed the same rule on both courses, (Graeagle and Plumas Pines) and they did adopted the new rule. So for the Invitational we will allow you to drop where the ball went out of bounds and incur a penalty stroke in order to speed up play.

HOLE NUMBER 10 – Please read the description in our Local Rules. We have made this change in order to be less punitive and to speed up play.

It is the time of year when we form a nominating committee to fill the officer positions for next year. Cathy Cianciolo and Judy Rossi have volunteered for this committee and are looking for interested members to fill the open positions. Please consider that if you do not step up, our club could look very different next year.
